On Saturday, September 26th starting at 10:00 A.M. and 1:00 P.M. the Potomac Division will hold two sessions of a scratch building clinic presented by fellow Potomac Division member Cam Green where attendees will build a styrene track side structure. The clinic will be held at Jerry Stanley's Hobby Barn located in Hume, Virginia. Jerry's address and phone number will be sent to members via a Potomac Division email. This clinic is a fund raiser to raise funds to offset the \$200.00 cost for a paid Zoom account to host on-line clinics and a paid account will allow the on-line clinics to exceed one-half hour in length.

For health and safety of the attendees each session will be limited to 8 members who will be seated 6' feet apart and masks will be required. Hand sanitizer and mask will be made available at the site if you need them. Coffee and snacks will be available at the clinic before they start. Supplies for the clinic are included in the participation fee which will be between \$20.00 to \$25.00 for the clinic and with a suggested \$ 5.00 or more, if you are able, donation for Potomac Division zoom cost of. **Tools to bring**

The styrene will be provide as part of the participation fee.

Participants will need to bring the following:

- 1) Hobby Knife (Exacto #10 Blade)
- 2) Steel Ruler or Scale Ruler even better
- 3) Sanding Sticks (like used for fingernails) or Sandpaper (100 or 200 grit)
- 4) Liquid Styrene Cement
- 5) Hobby Mat (so you protect the working surface)

Paint:

1. A base color for walls (your model railroad's standard color)
2. Trim color for Trim (your railroad's standard trim color)

**Other things in the area:**

Local wineries such as Winding Road Cellars, Philip Carter Winery, or the Desert Rose Ranch & Winery are in the immediate area. Within five miles away you will find "pick your own orchards" such as the Hartland, Stribling, or Hollins Farm Orchards. The Norfolk Southern Railroad "B" line is within four miles of Hobby barn where you can railfan and take some scenic photos. And approximately 30 minutes away there is the Strasburg Museum and an hour away is Harpers Ferry Toy Train Museum & Joy Line Railroad.

**A little about the Hobby Barn**



Jerry has constructed his, as the permit states, “shed” in the evenings and weekends over the past three years. Called the “Hobby Barn” by his friends it is 24’ by 24’ in size and has a 76” large screen TV, with surround sound, shaded skylights, heating and air conditioning and a handicap ramp with a grab bar for those that are less agile. It is set in the beautiful countryside of Hume, Virginia, with views of the Blue Ridge Mountains. It was built for the purpose of holding clinics, train movie events, meetings in general, train operations after the layout is built. There is parking available next to the Hobby barn for anyone who is handicapped.
